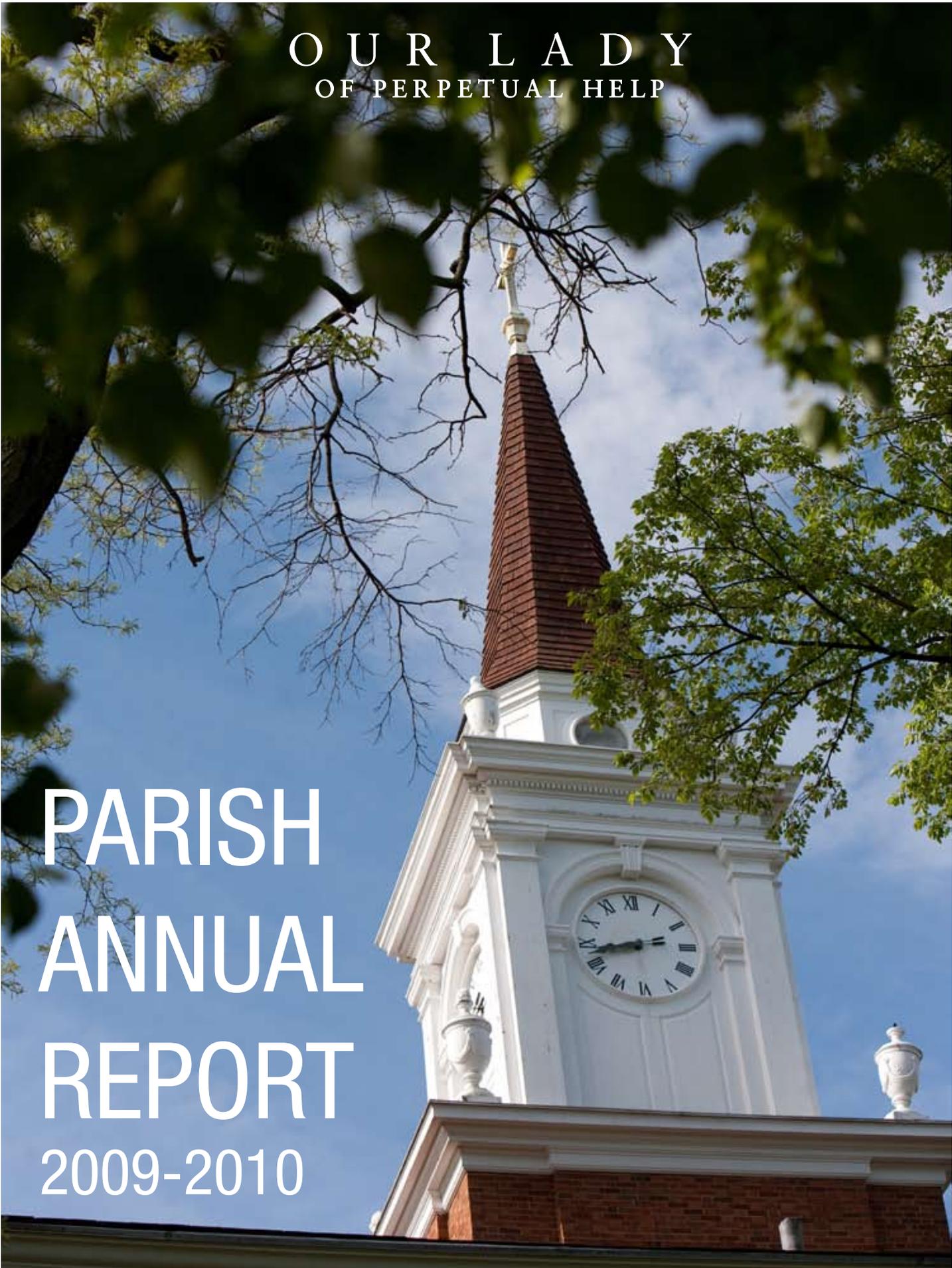

We have also experienced difficult times in the history of our church, and yet your faith in the message of Christ and the Church are exemplary. I encourage every adult member of our parish to take the time to participate in the survey.

The relationships we develop enrich our lives. This is a time for us to be imaginative as well as generous. A great future awaits us in which we can make a difference.

Connecting Faith to Everyday Life

Parishioners at Our Lady of Perpetual Help can choose from a rich variety of spiritual enrichment opportunities. Last fall the adult education efforts restructured and came together under the name EVOLVE. A dedicated group of parishioners has since worked to form small faith-sharing groups, to bring in engaging speakers, and to coordinate further opportunities for spiritual growth.

The list of new opportunities offered during 2009-10 is impressive. Last fall, the Men’s Spirituality group formed and began meeting once each month; about 18 - 25 men currently meet each second Saturday to share faith and deepen their spiritual lives. Dr. Ron Miller gave a series of presentations

on great mystics of Catholicism and Judaism. Parishioners formed small groups to practice contemplative living in the style of Thomas Merton. EVOLVE collaborated with St. Norbert parish to bring faculty members from Catholic Theological Union for talks on the traditions of our faith.

Other faith formation traditions gained momentum during this year. Renew Faith-Sharing groups continued, and the OLPH Book Club read and discussed challenging, thought-provoking spiritual books.

Wherever you are in your faith journey, OLPH is working to help you thrive and strengthen your commitment to Christ.

the school’s operating reserve. Thanks to the generous support of families to the Annual Fund, we are now able to purchase a significant number of interactive boards that will be installed at the start of this academic year.

The safety and well being of the students is always a top priority. Improvements were made to the facilities with the installation of a new security system.

Founded in 1929, OLPH School is the largest Catholic elementary school in the Chicago Archdiocese, educating nearly 1,000 children. Because of the generous parishioner support in 2009-2010, the school advanced its mission and thrived.

The spiritual growth of the children was fostered through prayer, study of scripture, and a variety of liturgical experiences. Embracing their role as young disciples of Christ, the children deepened their understanding of social justice issues. Adopting needy families at Christmas, sending care packages to soldiers, selling baked goods, and supporting the Haiti earthquake relief were some of the ways the children experienced Catholic Social Teaching.

During this difficult economic climate, school spending was closely monitored. We succeeded in maintaining the high quality of instruction, services and programs, without accessing

The school maintained its commitment to academic excellence, offering foreign language to the preschoolers and revising the science curriculum learning objectives. Lastly, OLPH invested in its teachers providing in-service workshops with Dr. Fran Prolman, an internationally recognized education consultant, to ensure a highly qualified teacher in every classroom.

During Catholic Schools Week, OLPH School celebrated 80 years of Catholic education by hosting an open house just for parishioners. Parishioners were invited to see first hand the school’s commitment to providing a quality education in the finest Catholic tradition ... Eighty Never Looked So Good!

OLPH Religious Education Update

Traditional R.E. Classes

This past year, the Religious Education Program at Our Lady of Perpetual Help continued to strive to provide children with experiences and relationships which will help them journey through life with integrity, compassion, hope and wonder. We continued to seek ways to encourage and foster the tools for each child to grow in their own unique spirituality. Helping the parents in their roles as primary religious educators of their children, parents became more immersed with their child’s ongoing faith development. Parents were enthusiastically encouraged to attend the various prayer services, social events and service opportunities during the year. Their participation in these celebrations fostered a strong community of dedicated parents and strengthened their own faith.

Family TREE

The first year of Religious Education’s Family TREE Program was a great success as committed families grew together in their faith through prayer, discussion, faith sharing and family activities. We had a total of 23 families enrolled this year and have grown to include 40 families for the coming 2010-11 school year.

Eighth Grade Confirmation

The 8th grade Confirmation students participated in the first annual Confirmation Service Fair where they shared their experience of service and faith with all the children of RE. A total of 134 students were Confirmed in March 2010.

Sharing Highlights

Our own community found many more families and individuals wrestling with financial issues, and Sharing resources are stretched thin. That being said, OLPH parishioners have been extremely generous in responding to the cry of those in need, providing food, clothing, household goods and monetary donations. Whatever the need, the parish answers the call.

Sharing Picnic

Hundreds of sharing parish parishioners enjoyed a fun-filled day at the OLPH Sharing Picnic on Sunday, July 18.

The Playdium and parking lot were abuzz with people enjoying games, pony rides, music, socializing, and great food, an abundance of which also allowed for take home containers for our guests.

OLPH Parishioners showed true hospitality to our guests and provided a wonderful day of relief from the concerns of inner-city life.



Sharing Service Day

Parishioners also came out in strong numbers for the 2nd annual Sharing Service Day on Saturday, June 12. About 200 parishioners, including families with children of all ages, participated in service at our inner-city sharing parishes as well as a Catholic Charities Women and Children’s shelter in Waukegan.

There was also a good turnout for area volunteer opportunities in the Sharing Room, at Maryhaven and at Patten House. Parishioners painted, cleaned, gardened, distributed food, assembled lunch bags and medical kits, wrote notes, sang songs, played bingo and much more. The energy was palpable as all set out to do God’s work.

- November, 2009: Parishioner Betty Collins received the Christifideles ministry award from the Cardinal.
- January, 2010: Little by Little Medical Mission traveled to Haiti and helped hundreds of injured people after the devastating earthquake there.
- January, 2010: Parish Leadership Summit I was held in preparation for the Strategic Plan.
- January, 2010: New music area was created in the church's North transept.
- March, 2010: Leadership Summit II was held, leading to further recommendations for Strategic Plan.
- April, 2010: RCIA brought eleven new members into the Catholic faith.
- June, 2010: The second annual Sharing Service Day involved 200 parishioners.
- July, 2010: School administration building and church received needed exterior paint job.

Where Do My Donations Go?

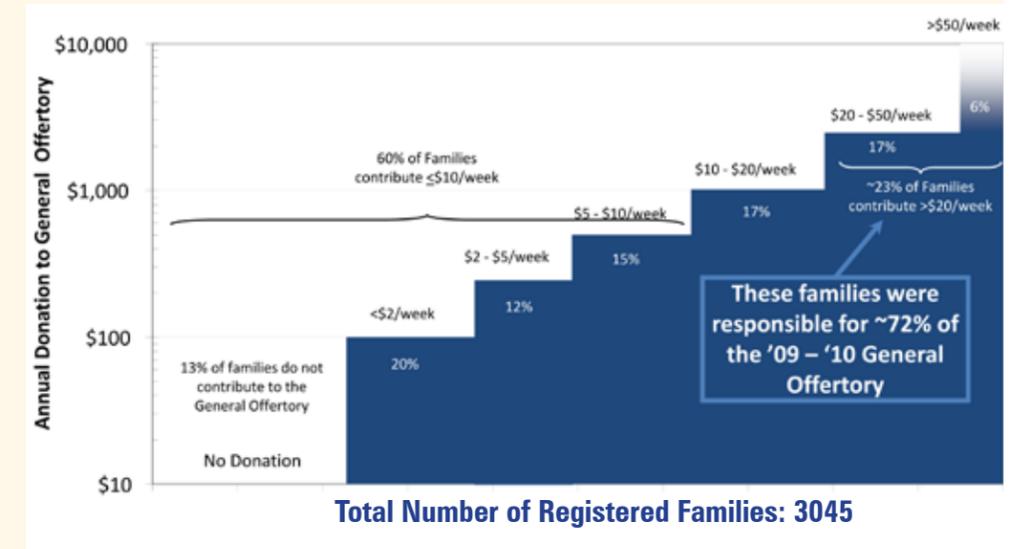
Your Donations to the General Offertory:

Comprised of Sunday and Holy Day Collections, the Offertory supports all parish ministries.

- 35% to School
- 20% to Salaries
- 16% to Administration
- 15% to Maintenance, Utilities & Repairs
- 11% to Ministries
- 2% to Miscellaneous

1. We received two generous bequests this year: one in the amount of \$100,000. Bequest funds are used exclusively within the Parish and help to supplement the Parish reserves.

2. The Wagner Trust was established at a local bank in 2000 based on the trusts of the late Peter and Rose Wagner. The Parish receives an annual distribution of 5% of the Trust principal balance as of the previous calendar year.

3. This rebate from the Archdiocese is the amount that was donated to the Cardinal's appeal above our goal; nearly \$50,000 less than last year's.

4. This year our payments to the Diocese for our insurance, assessment and priests' retirement went up 14%. Normal office expenses remained about the same as last year.

5. This includes expenses for the Water Retention obligation \$ 81,765; plus repairs to church plaza, north entrance to church and heat and hot water systems that will result in significant savings.

6. This money was funded by our reserves for a number of one time expenses; we had an operating surplus of \$185,136.

1. Salaries were frozen for Administrators, Teachers, and Staff in 2009 - 2010.

2. Due to the difficult economic climate, the need for scholarship spending increased while donations declined.

3. An excellent response to our Annual Fund will allow the school to spend technology funds held in reserve pending year end budget performance.

4. The School Endowment Fund Board is fully in charge and is responsible for all disbursements from the fund. Per the charter, amounts not exceeding 5% of the previous calendar year end market value of fund assets may be distributed to the school.

Our Reserve

Through the past generosity of our donors, Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish has been able to accumulate reserves. As with any large organization, we maintain reserve funds to cover unexpected capital expenditures and for unexpected decreases in revenues or increases in expenses. Thanks to prudent budgeting and a mild winter both the church and the school experienced operating surpluses this year (\$185k and \$62K respectively). This year we once again did a number of needed capital projects in the amount of \$316,300. The main ones being:

- \$ 81,765 Water Retention Obligation
- \$ 13,295 Concrete Stairs and Plaza Repairs
- \$ 128,166 New Heating and Hot Water System for Playdium & Mt. Vernon Buildings. This will greatly reduce our gas bills going forward.

The Finance Council believes it is imperative to maintain this level in reserve. Our combined church and school annual budget is over 9 million dollars. Our campus is extensive and while we have done much to repair and maintain it recently, the potential for costly repairs exists.

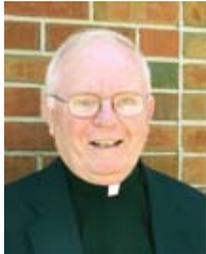
